



USING THIS GUIDE:

This guide outlines a path for degree completion at Webster University for the *Bachelor of Arts in Legal Studies* for students entering with an *Associate in Applied Science degree in Paralegal Studies* from Southwestern Illinois College. This should not be used in place of individual academic advising. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a Webster University transfer admissions counselor early in their academic career to ensure a smooth transfer experience.

IMPORTANT TRANSFER NOTES:

Webster has a minimum residency requirement that 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be taken at Webster University. All students must have a minimum of 120 credit hours to graduate.

A minimum of 18 credit hours of the required 51 credit hours of academic work must be taken in the Department of Legal Studies at Webster University.

Courses completed with a grade below a C- do not count toward fulfilling the specific course requirements of the major or general education/Global Citizenship Program.

Webster University provides full transfer of coursework successfully completed as part of an associate degree awarded by a regionally accredited institution. While students with associate's degrees typically transfer 60-66 credit hours, Webster will transfer in all coursework that is part of the completed associate degree. Transfer of additional lower-division credit beyond the associate's degree is restricted. All transfer credit is capped at 90 credit hours.
