Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or the CBHE CORE 42 block of general education before transferring to Webster University will have satisfied the general education requirements and GLBC 1200 Global Cornerstone Seminar requirement of the GCP. All students are required to take the Global Keystone Seminar at Webster.

Students completing other associate degrees will have previous credits reviewed on a course-by-course basis for applicability to the GCP. *See GCP Transfer Guide developed for East Central College.*
