DEPARTMENT OF TEACHER EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to education major and teacher certification requires the following:

- x Successful completion of all sections of the GEA Exam by 64 credit hours of college coursework or have an ACT composite score of 20 or greater. Transfer students who choose to take the GEA exam must pass all sections during the first semester following transfer to Webster University.
- x Written Program of Study (PS) outlining the degree and program requirements developed upon transfer to Webster (or by completion of 64 credit hours)

Students should be directed to complete the following coursework as part of the AAT:

General Education (42 CR)

ENG 10, 101H English Composition I (3)

Must complete one college composition course with a grade of Better
