A cumulative GPA on all college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual consideration. If you have circumstances which might affect your admission this may be discussed confidentially with a member of the admissions staff. The University operates on rolling admission, and application files are reviewed by an admissions counselor as soon as all requested credentials have been received.

IMPORTANT RANSFERIOTES

- Webster University has a minimum residerrequirement that 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be taken at Webster University. All students must have a minimum of 128 credit hours to graduate.
- Courses completed with a grade below-ad6 not count toward fulfilling the specific course requirements of the major or general education/Global Citizenship Program.
- Transfer students who have taken introductory coursework in the major should not expect to complete their degree in fewer than four semesters due to sequential nature of courses.
- Most students who major in the School of Communications must complete a portfolio review as a requirement for graduation. This portfolio review or its equivalent is the prequisite for an Internship or Senior Overview.
