#### WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual

#### REQUIRED COURSES

Please be aware that admission to the Art, Design, and Art History Department is by portfolio review for majors within this department: course equivalencies to Webster in ART, DESN, ARHS may be subject to portfolio review by the department faculty.

Other studio art and art history courses may be transferable to Webster. Equivalencies will be determined by the Art Department after initial portfolio review.
