Students take courses in a variety of formats (small, medium and large), materials (black/white and color) and technical environments (chemical and digital). Students become familiar with a variety of approaches (journalistic, commercial/editorial and scientific), while concentrating on one.

#### WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative GPA on college-level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual
